The meeting was called to order at 4:00 p.m. by Chairman Henley and noted for the record a quorum present.

The minutes from July 17 were approved as presented. The minutes from August 1<sup>st</sup> were approved as amended (correcting Councilman Jeff Norris to Councilman Gary Norris).

**BUILDING & CODES DEPARTMENT**

Mr. Smith presented his monthly reports and stated that he would answer any questions. Wesley Chapel Church demolition will start in about 10 days. Dunkin Donuts is joining forces with Baskin Robbins on Wilma Rudolph Blvd. Talked about single family permits changes over the years but it was stated that they just go up and down throughout the year. Cost of construction is inflation but we're actually ahead.

**FIRE DEPARTMENT**

Chief Montgomery presented his monthly reports and briefly discussed them. Runs are backing up EMS. He had a short power point for the committee and they are attached for the record. He has it broken down into divisions and what they have done.

Fire Prevention staff attended a seminar for one week but still did 260 inspections, issued 12 commercial burn permits, installed 60 smoke detectors, had 11 public events, and reviewed 15 sets of new plans. Working on a project with APSU and having students help with the installation of smoke detectors in the general area. Have tasked them with getting with different departments and being on the front end instead of the back.
